## 1 Description

The PX249 is an audio player that replaces the existing PX154 MP3 player.

The device can be controlled directly or with the use of any driver operating in the DMX-512 standard. The player can cooperate with DMX devices in 4, 5, 7 or 8 channel modes.

From the firmware version 1.18 on the SD/SDHC memory card you can place 85 or 255 tracks in the main directory on the card in the \*.wav format of any length, the only limitation is the capacity of the memory card. In addition, from firmware version 1.18 it is possible to create up to 9 playlists of 85 or 255 tracks each, which gives the possibility to play up to 765 or 2295 tracks.

Functions implemented by PX249 using DMX control allow for playback, selection of a particular song, choosing a playlist, looping one and multiple track or random playback of songs, smooth volume control, bass, treble and balance control. Additionally, there is a possibility to connect an external *START* button. Moreover, the menu of the device allows for defining the behavior of the player if no DMX signal is present.


The unit is produced in a housing adapted for mounting on 35mm DIN buses.

## 2 Safety conditions

The PX249 Audio DMX Player is a device powered with 12 - 24V DC safe voltage. However, during its installation and use the following rules must be strictly observed:


- 1. The device may only be connected to 12 24V DC current (stabilized voltage) with current-carrying capacity compatible with technical data.
- 2. All the conductors should be protected against mechanical and thermal damage.
- 3. In the event of any conductor damaging, it should be replaced with the one of the same parameters.
- 4. Connection of DMX signal should be made with shielded conductor.
- 5. All repairs and connections of outputs or DMX signal can only be made with switched off power supply.
- 6. The PX249 should be strictly protected against contact with water and other liquids.
- 7. All sudden shocks particularly dropping should be avoided.
- 8. The device cannot be turned on in places with humidity exceeding 90%.
- 9. The device cannot be used in places with temperature lower than +2°C or higher than +40°C.
- 10. For cleaning use only a damp cloth.

## 4 Navigating the menu

Navigating the menu of the device allow programmable buttons. Every button is described on the right side and their use is as follows:



## 5 Player state after turning on the device

When PX249 is turned on, the start menu appears on the screen. The menu design varies depending on whether the device is receiving the DMX signal or not. Direct keyboard support (played track control) is possible when the DMX signal is not being received.

Selecting the **[Menu]** and confirming the selection with the *enter* key will enter the menu, where you can select the playlist to be played, audio settings, DMX address, change additional options and check the information about the firmware.

If no DMX signal is received, you can change the playback settings directly on the initial menu. To do so, you need to select the icon:

- **p**lay
- **III** pause
- stop
- rewind
- forward

and then confirm your selection by pressing enter.

Similarly, you can change the volume level, playback mode and track number. To do this, use the following keys: ▶ and ◄.

## 6 Audio formats, memory cards and files naming

The Audio DMX Player supports audio files in the \*.wav format with the following parameters only:

- \*.wav files with bits per sample value 16-bit on two-channels
- acceptable sampling frequencies:
  - 8 kHz
  - ∘ 16 kHz
  - 22,05 kHz
  - 32 kHz
  - o 44,1 kHz
  - 48 kHz

**NOTE!** The player supports only SD or SDHC cards formatted in the FAT32 file system. There must be no more than 255 files on the memory card in the root folder. In addition, in each of the eight playlists (files in the root directory are treated as a *root* playlist) also can not be placed more than 255 files in each of them. A higher number of tracks or additional directories can result in the module's malfunctions when changing tracks.

Playlists 1 through 8 are in the folders on the SD / SDHC memory card with the following names: *p01* ... *p08*. The ninth playlist is the *root* playlist, which is the main directory of the memory card.

#### <u>Tracks on the SD card should be named according to the following principle:</u>

#### xxx\_ABCD...O.wav

where:

xxx - numbers from 001 up to 255

**ABCD...0** – the name of the song containing up to 15 alphanumeric characters displayed on the main screen

\*.wav - wav file extension

#### Example:

001\_Music.wav

002\_Mozart.wav

003\_Beethoven.wav



**NOTE!** If the correct track naming or the maximum number of tracks are not followed, playback or track changing problems may occur.

## 7 Player menu

After going to the [Menu] tab, you can edit the following options:



## 7.1 Playlists

The [Playlists] submenu allows to preview the list of songs in each playlist recorded on the SD / SDHC card and in the absence of DMX control to change the playlist or currently playing song.

To change the playlist / song, select the appropriate playlist (*Root, p01 ... p08*) and confirm the selection with the *enter* key.

After selecting the playlist, select the song you want to play currently, and then confirm your selection with the *enter* button.




**NOTE!** To change the playlist using DMX signal, in the **[DMX settings]** (7.3 DMX settings), change **[DMX mode]** to *5ch* or *8ch*, then 5 or 8 channel is responsible for changing the playlist number.

#### 7.2 Audio settings

This submenu allows additional audio parameters to be changed. The user can modify the Bass, Treble and Balance settings. All parameters can be changed in the range from -10 up to +10.

In order to make changes to these parameters, select a given setting, confirm your selection by pressing *enter*, and then use the ► or ≺ keys to change the value as needed.


Return to the previous screen by pressing escape or enter.



**NOTE!** In order to change the **[Bass]** and **[Treble]** settings, activate the **[Equalizer]** function in the **[Additional options]** (7.4 Additional options) menu.

#### 7.3 DMX settings

Selecting a bookmark **[DMX settings]** allows to change the settings related to operation in the DMX mode.



The DMX start address can be set in the range from 1 to 505 / 506 / 508 / 509. The range depends on the setting of the **[DMX mode]**, this is because the device automatically takes up subsequent addresses after the starting address. For example, if the *4ch* (it occupies 4 consecutive channels) and the DMX start address is set to 509, the first device channel will be occupied by the DMX channel number 509 and the last 512 channel.


In the [No signal] mode, you can set the following:

- off the playback stops after the DMX signal disappears
- run the player automatically starts working according to the parameters set in the [No signal] mode:
  - ch1 play, stop, pause
  - ch2 the number of the song being played (1 85 or 1 255, depending on whether the [More tracks (255)] option in the [Additional options] 7.4 Additional options is active or not)
  - ch3 operating mode ([single track], [repeat track], [single playlist], [repeat playlist], [single random], [repeat random], [random all once], [random all loop])
  - ch4 volume (range 0 100%)
  - ch5/8 playlist to be played (value 0 and 9 255 match the *root* playlist, values from 1 to 8 correspond to the following playlist numbers *p01* ... *p08*)
- last the player continues its previously work (maintaining the last vale of the DMX signal)
- ext1 starts a track using an external button in accordance with the parameters defined in [No signal] (applies only to: ch2, ch3, ch4, ch5/8 ch1 is not taken into account, it is always treated as play), each successive press of the external button will replay the defined track
- ext2 starts a track using an external button in accordance with the parameters defined in [No signal] (applies only to: ch2, ch3, ch4, ch5/8 ch1 is not taken into account, it is always treated as play), each subsequent pressing of an external key during the song will not cause

any reaction, the song will be played back to the end, looped, the whole playlist or playlist will be played all the time in the loop (depending on the *ch3* settings)

#### 7.4 Additional options

In this submenu, you can change the interpretation of the o DMX value. By the default the 0 value for each channel is changing the behavior of the device (e.g. for channel 1 stops playing), but after checking the box in this menu the zero is interpreted as neutral.



[DMX filter] – filtration of short-term changes in the DMX signal. The player will react to the value if it remains unchanged for at least 5 DMX frames.


**[Equalizer]** – switching on the equalizer allows to change the tone in the **[Audio settings]** menu. Turning off increases the volume.

**[DMX volume lock]** – when the DMX is used for control, the volume level is locked at a value set using the keyboard. After restarting the device, it takes the value from the **[DMX settings]** menu.

[More tracks (255)] – activating this function allows to handle up to 255 tracks on one playlist, by default this option is off (support for up to 85 tracks on one playlist). After turning this function on or off, the device must be restarted.

#### 7.5 Firmware info

The submenu [Firmware info] includes the following information:



To restore the default settings in the device, confirm the highlighted onscreen [Restore defaults] button and select the [Yes] button visible on the screen. Confirm with *enter*.

**NOTE!** Please note that if the default settings are restored, all the previous configuration settings on the device will be lost.

## 8 Firmware update

The PX249 firmware update procedure is as follows:

- 1. Prepare an empty SD card (FAT32 file system)
- 2. Upload only the update file to the card (extension \*.upg)
- 3. Disconnect the Audio DMX Player from the mains
- 4. Remove the existing SD card and insert a new one that is updated
- 5. Reconnect the updated device to the mains

The update procedure is automatic. After the end of the process, the start menu will appear.

**NOTE!** After the update has been completed, remove the card with the update as otherwise it will update your device whenever it is powered up.

#### 9 DMX-512 control

The device can be controlled via four, five, seven or eight channels

#### 9.1 Control via 4 or 5 channels

Channel 1: stop / pause / resume / start

#### DMX values:

0 - 63 - [stop]

64 - 127 - [pause]

128 - 255 - resume / start [play]

**NOTE!** When [More tracks (255)] is active, the value of the DMX signal corresponds to the number of the song.


Channel 3: playback mode – *single* (a selected track is played once), *single loop* (a selected track is played back repeatedly), *single continuous* (starting from a selected track, the playback runs one after the other, the playback is stopped after the last track), *continuous loop* (starting from a selected track, the playback runs in a specific order, the first track is played after the last one in the list), *single random* (randomly selected song played once), *single random in loop* (randomly selected song is played repeatedly), *single continuous random* (starting from a random track, the playback runs randomly, the playback is stopped after the last track), *continuous loop random* (starting from a random track, the playback runs randomly).

#### DMX values:

- 0 64 single playback [single track]
- 65 127 single loop playback [repeat track]
- 128 191 single continuous playback [single playlist]
- 192 251 continuous loop playback [repeat playlist]
- 252 single random playback [single random]
- 253 single random playback in loop [repeat random]
- 254 single continuous random playback [random all once]
- 255 continuous loop random playback **[random all loop]**

#### Channel 4: volume control

On the fourth DMX channel, the device supports volume control in the range from 0 up to 100%. The volume is changed linearly in accordance with the following schedule: for the DMX signal with a value of 0 the volume is 0%, while for the value of 255 the volume is 100%.



<u>Channel 5:</u> change of playlist (only available for 5-channel 5 ch control mode)

**NOTE!** In 4-channel mode, only files from the *root* playlist (root directory on the memory card) are played. Playback of 85 tracks (first 85 out of 255) and *4 ch* mode are set to the default.

#### 9.2 Control via sever or eight channels

In the seven or eight DMX channels mode, in addition to the same settings on the first four channels (as for the four- and five-channel mode) PX249 can change parameters of [Bass], [Treble] and [Balance] on the fifth, sixth, and seventh channel.

All channels in this mode (7 ch and 8 ch) are described below:

Channel 1: stop / pause / resume / start

<u>Channel 2:</u> selection of the song number in the range 1 - 85 or 1 - 255 (depending on the settings [More tracks (255)])

<u>Channel 3:</u> playback mode – single, single loop, single track list, looped track list, single random, single random loop, single random track list, looped random track list

Channel 4: volume control (0 - 100%)

**NOTE!** Channels from 1 to 4 are described in detail in section 9.1 Control via 4 or 5 channels.

<u>Channel 5:</u> bass control (in range from -10 to +10)

Channel 6: treble control (in range from -10 to +10)

<u>Channel 7:</u> balance control (L -10, -9 ... 0 ... +9, +10 R)

For each of the three additional channels (5, 6, 7), adjustment through DMX control is made for the same values. These values are shown in the table below.



<u>Channel 8:</u> change of the playlist (available only for 8-channel 8 ch control, DMX values corresponding to a specific playlist are described in the **channel 5** table in point 9.1 Control via 4 or 5 channels)


**NOTE!** In 7-channel mode, only files from the *root* playlist (root directory on the memory card) are played.


a) amplifier connection diagram (unbalanced output)




#### b) amplifier connection diagram (balanced output)




#### c) speakers connection diagram
